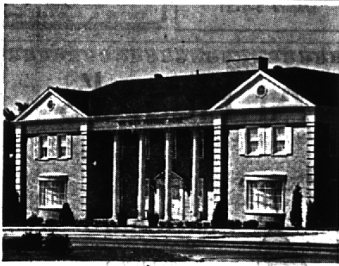

Troy News Briefs

School Additions May Be Delayed Says Supt. Smith

TROY — School Superintendent Rex E. Smith said a progress report recently made indicates that additions of Morse and Leonard Elementary schools may not be ready for occupancy by the second semester at the end of January.

The delay, due to difficulty in obtaining window frames, will cause no problems, Smith said. Pupils now attending the schools will move into the additions when they are finished. Completion date is not known yet, Smith indicated.

Under construction at Morse School are 10 rooms; 18 are being built at Leonard. The high school addition will be completed next July, according to the schedule.

A report on the football season indicated a total income for the season of \$3,368.34, with expenditures reaching \$3,269.95.

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION awarded five contracts totaling \$12,221.10. They were for high school parking lot lighting; Classroom shades; sewage tank contracts at the Leonard and Morse schools and repairs at Big Beaver School.

The Board also renewed three year contracts for the superintendent and assistant superintendent. Contracts were also renewed for the business manager and for the senior and junior high school principals.

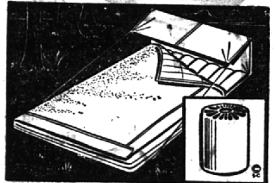
