The men, all members of the Senior Men's Club at Birmingham Community House made the visit Friday afternoon.

Harry Burch, 33883 Sylvan lane, Beverly Hills, 1960 president of the four year-old organization, said the men assembled at the Community House, drove to the home of Mrs. Fred O. Gould, 8700 Monterey court, Foxcroft, for their annual Christmas party. They proceeded to the child's home to distribute gifts that each member had purchased.

BURCH SAID about 60 members showed up for the parties, about half of the membership.

"Attendance at our functions, whether our twice-weekly meetings or at special affairs such as those scheduled for Friday, is usually high and indicates interest in the club," Burch said. "I'm just echoing comments made time-and-again by others. I don't know what we did with our time before this club was founded."

"They assist quietly in so many ways that I believe it would be impossible to list in detail the activities or accomplishments of these gentlemen," says Mrs. Eric Schaffer, executive director of the Community House.

Some idea, however, can be obtained from some of the members. One recalls the time he and a fellow member answered a call from the Birmingham municipal court to pinch-hit as jurors.

Another little publicized service is an unofficial advisors to high school teen-agers.

THE IDEA FOR the SMC grew out of the establishment in 1951 by the Community House board of directors of a Senior Women's club. Membership in SMC is open to any person who is retired. Members are from all walks of life... a former auto executive, a gardener, a former chemical engineer, a police officer, a judge. They age range upwards from 55 to George Reish, 104 Westchester, Bloomfield township, who is 92.

"We were people watchers before they started this club," recalls one member. "I used to sit in the drug store and watch the people walk in and out. It might sound strange, but it's rather lonely when you idle away the hours of daylight that for the previous 35 or 40 years were spent working and talking with people."

THE SMC MEETS every Tuesday and Friday at the Community House Luncheon (for 60 cents) is served.

Tuesday meetings, attended by 20-25 members, consist of indoor or outdoor shuffleboard, depending on the season, and bridge, cribbage and canasta.

Friday is the day for the regular business meeting with 60 to 70 members attending. The business meeting consists of announcements and introductions, appearance of a speaker or the screening of a movie. Luncheon is followed by a panel discussion of a topic selected the week previous.

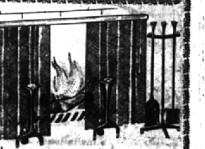
