

One of the nation's most unique fire departments was dedicated in Franklin. Organized in 1949 the Franklin Volunteer Fire Department is operated and financed purely through annual voluntary contributions.

Frank Garland, Hope Linatruth and Mary Woodworth, all of Birmingham, attended the annual delegate assembly of the department of classroom teachers, the largest affiliate organization of the Michigan Education Association.

Part of the state highway department's \$13.8 million to be spent on emergency resurfacing projects was planned on US-10 from 11 to 14 Mile roads and 10 Mile south to Lincoln in Pleasant Ridge.

Four musical groups from Birmingham schools nabbed high rating classifications at the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association's district four festival at Northville.

Birmingham Maple tankers won the Eastern Michigan league swimming title.


The Cranbrook Cranes came from behind to clinch the international high school hockey crown.
