Issue of March 24
 Judith M. Bollman, 18, Pontiac, won a Ford Falcon in the Shop in Birmingham contest. More than 50,000 entries were received.

Earl G. Ward, 650 Lone Pine road, Bloomfield Hills, was named general chairman of the 1960 Torch Drive. He is a Ford Motor Co. vice president.

New construction—primarily commercial and multiple dwellings—accounted for the \$1,523,340 increase in Birmingham's 1960 assessed valuation, according to City Assessor Clark Clark Hagstrom.

Birmingham Country Club turned a brand new face toward the coming social season. A southern plantation mural was added to the newly painted dining room.

In a unanimous vote, Marvin B. Cline was re-elected to a third one-year term as Beverly Hills village president. The council chose Chester F. Guilmet's president pro tem.

Issue of March 31
 Carl Sandburg, internationally-known poet, author, folk singer, was announced as a featured personality in the third annual Birmingham Arts Festival.

Four Birmingham Eccentric reporters and photographers were presented with 13 prizes in the annual Michigan Press Photographers news pictures contest.

The Rev. Robert S. Graham and his family were honored by members of First Presbyterian Church. Rev. Graham devoted his attention to duties at the church for the last 10 years.

Virginia (Mrs. Maurice V.) Rogers announced her resignation from the Beverly Hills village plan board. The resignation made the fourth from the nine-member group since the summer.

Birmingham thincads captured the Huron relay at Ypsilanti.

Issue of April 7
 Dwight B. Ireland submitted his resignation as superintendent of Birmingham Public Schools after 18 years of service.

Northminster Presbyterian Church began construction on the church property (Big Beaver road, just east of Adams), with completion scheduled early fall. A new church school wing and a fellowship hall were to be included.

Guests were expected from the Art Center in Kalamazoo, Flint, Windsor and Metropolitan Detroit for a house tour May 1 of five outstanding homes in Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills. Theme of the tour sponsored by Bennington College Alumnae Association of Detroit was "Arts for Leisure."

An election mix-up developed in Lathrup Village over the legality of some of the votes cast for three sticker candidates. Only one of the three—John B. Kohl—was elected to the council, according to the ruling of City Clerk Frank Derby and the city election commission which he headed.

Jay Myers, 12-year veteran swimming coach at Seaholm High School, resigned.

April 14
 Florence Willett, for 12 months city commissioner, plan board member and mayor pro tem, was elected Birmingham's first woman mayor.

A group of Bloomfield Hills area residents joined in the formation of Bloomfield Hills Baptist Church, which met temporarily at Hickory Grove School on Lather Rd.

A ruling in favor of the Vil-

lage of Beverly Hills was handed down last week by Oakland County circuit Judge Clark J. Adams in a case involving zoning of 1 1/2 Mile Rd. property for a gas station.
