Chapel is president of the Rutgers China and glass house in Disneyland and made a perfect guide for the Kravits on their tour of Disneyland.

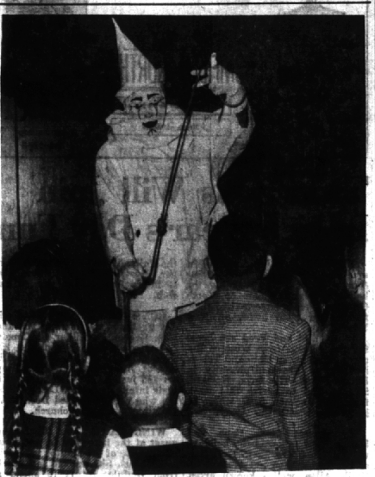

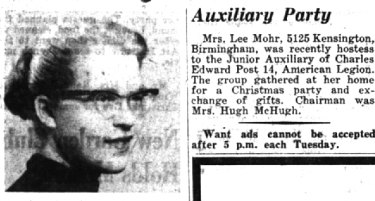
Mr. and Mrs. Joseph LaPlant were hosts at a cocktail party and buffet supper at their Meadowlake road home, Dec. 23.
