AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 8 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING CONDUCT CONSTITUTING AN OFFENSE BY PERSONS IN THE VILLAGE, OF BEVERLY HILLS: PREVENTING VICE, DISORDER AND INMANITY: PROMOTING PUBLIC PEACE, SAFETY AND HEALTH: PROTECTING PUBLIC MORALS: PROTECTING PUBLIC MORALS: PROTECTING PUBLIC MORALS: PROTECTING PUBLIC AND PREVENTEY AND PRESCRIBING PENALTHES FOR VIOLATIONS OF ITS PROVISIONS.

The Village of Beverly Hills Ordains:

Section 1.01 That Section 3 (2) of Ordinance No. 9 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Conduct Constituting an Offense by Persons in the Village of Beverly Hills, Preventing Vice, Discrete and Immorality, Promoting Public Peace, Safety and Health, Protecting Public Morals; Protecting Public and Private Property and Preserthing Penattees for Violations of its Provisions" be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 3 (2). Assault and Battery. No person in the Village shall attempt to commit an assault and battery or commit an assault and battery upon the person of another."

Section 2.91. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and shall become effective immediately upon publication.
