Simpler Signs Best, Says Birmingham

The simpler and smaller the signs are, the more they fit into Birmingham's residential nature, the city commission reaffirmed Monday night. Commissioners turned down J. A. Citrin's proposed ordinance amendments which would permit the commission to make certain exceptions in sign size, location and set-back.

Commissioners agreed the present size limitation — 100 square feet per sign face — is large enough. Citrin wanted a 200-foot face for a sign at his new gas station under construction at Chestnut and U.S. 10.

ANOTHER of Citrin's suggested amendments would have permitted the city staff to make certain allowances in some cases. City Manager L. R. Gare opposed this. He said ordinances are best administered if city officials are required to make few discretionary decisions.

(Continued from Page 1-A) The Birmingham chapter of the "Citizens for Michigan" will hold a general meeting Wednesday, Feb. 10 at 8 p.m. in the Birmingham Community House. According to Raymond A. Von Drehle, secretary-treasurer of the chapter, the guest speaker for the night will be Ralph W. Conant, executive director of the CFM, who will discuss the progress of the group on a State-wide basis. The chapter will also hear special study group reports on state finances, 2001-2002 structural changes in state government. The main purposes of the CFM is to allow interested citizens a chance to study the problems of the State government and through group discussion come up with constructive ideas that are beneficial to the State and hence to the citizens.

A trial date has not been set for the nurse who waived examination before Judge Edward Emery in Birmingham municipal court last week.

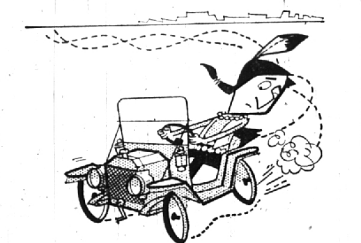
She took the money between Jan. 1, 1957 and the present, according to charges by Dr. R. Hamilton White, of 584 Hamilton

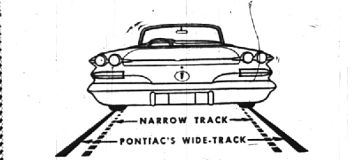
It is obvious that both of Bloomfield's justices enjoy their contact with community problems and serving the community through the office of justice of the peace.
