"Facts You Should Know About Mental Health" is the subject chosen by the first speaker, Harold G. Webster, executive-director of the Michigan society for mental health. Chairman of the three sessions will be the Rev. John W. Wigle, vicar of the Episcopal Church of the Advent and member of the Oakland county chapter of the Michigan society for mental health.

The group, led by the Rev. Lester Mondale and called the Minister's Study Group, is considering the historical and philosophical background of Unitarianism and the place of liberal religion in its more comprehensive setting.

Through study and discussion, the group will attempt to discover what people ask of religion, what needs religion has satisfied in the past and the meaning today in the various religious concepts of God, prayer, rituals, revelations, mysticism, religious love and hate and other aspects.

Seminars on church music, repertoire, conducting and the literature of organ music over the last three centuries will be discussed and demonstrated.

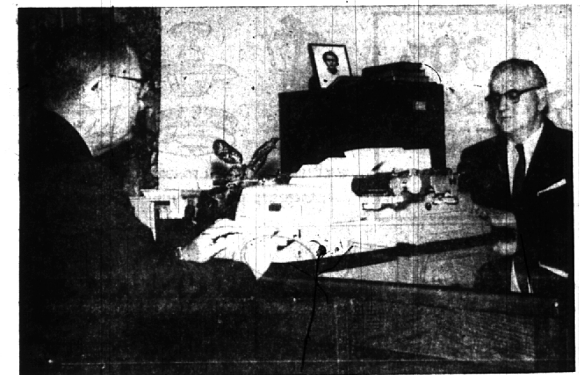
Unitarians Plan
