19 State Senators Are Opposed to Candidate Bagwell

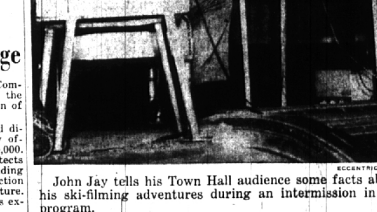
