

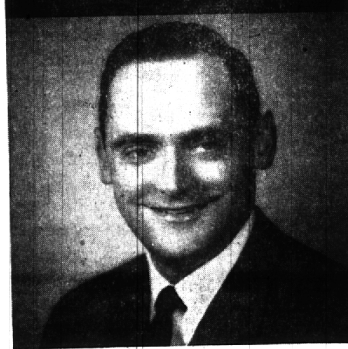

Those interested in learning more about Michigan government, whether as members of "Citizens for Michigan" groups or as individuals, will find Baldwin public library can supply not only material for home borrowing, but also copies of "Know Your State," a valuable 58-page booklet on sale at the library's main desk, according to Miss Jeanne Lloyd, librarian.

This popular League of Women Voters publication, which sells at 50 cents, shows where state funds are derived and how they are spent.

CARTOONS illustrate how a bill becomes a Michigan law. The text discusses the state constitution and its history, duties of state officials, offices, boards, departments, and commissions.

It points out the work of the Legislature and the courts as well as state services such as education, public health, and highways. Readers will also find the suggested reading list of considerable value.

Mrs. Marguerite Anderson, reference librarian, also invites "Citizens for Michigan" workers to visit the reference desk for a variety of loan material concerning Michigan government.

The "Citizens for Michigan" reading list has been checked and books and magazines available at Baldwin public library have been collected at the reference desk. Although some material is limited to use only in the library, most may be taken out.

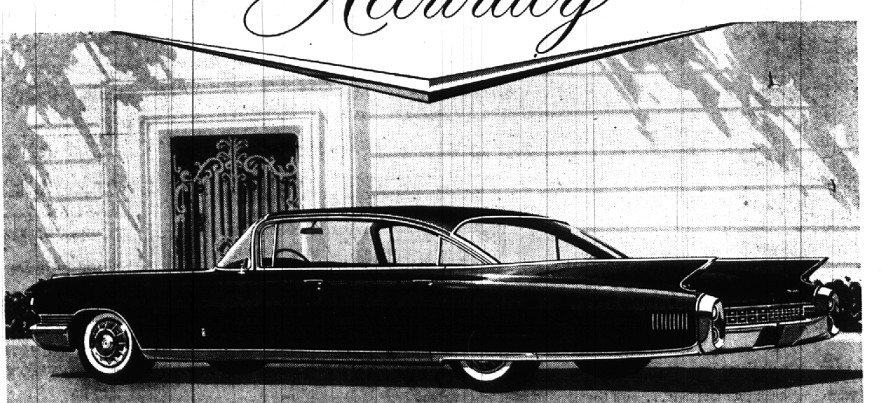
