Divine Science Unity, formerly known as the Birmingham Unity Ministry, is now affiliated with Divine Science of Denver after a majority vote Jan. 10.

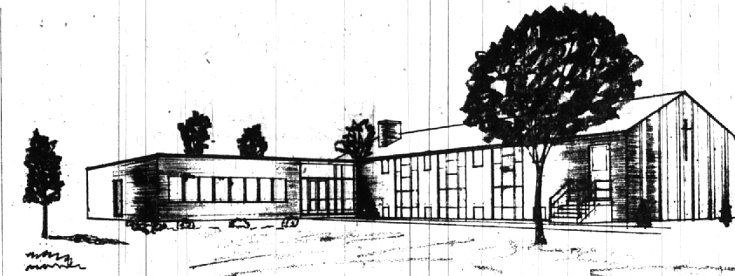
