Bloomfield Township Acts To Hire Firm

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — The firm of Vilcan-Leman became official township planning consultants by resolution of the township board Monday night. The contract is for two years at \$4,500.

The board's action had been anticipated after its favorable reaction several weeks ago to recommendations from the township zoning board that an over-all master plan for future township growth be developed. The zoning board recommended Vilcan-Leman for the job.

A second resolution passed by the board requires the referral of all plans to the zoning board for consideration before being brought before the township board for final approval.

A PLAT for further development of Branch of Bloomfield, north of Maple and east of Inkster, was presented to the board for approval Monday night. It became the first to fall under the new plat approval set-up, when the board referred developers to the zoning board. Further action of the board included passage of a bond resolution for a \$30,000 sewer development in Broughton Farms, tentative approval of an upgrading of lot sizes in Colberry Park; continuing the roll for paving of roads in Jackson Park; acceptance of a petition for blacktopping roads in Chelmsleigh subdivision; and acceptance of a petition for installation of three street lights in Franklin-Look Lake road estates. Final action was the adoption of a uniform traffic code for Michigan townships.
