Southfield Sets March 24 Hearing On Rezone Request

SOUTHFIELD—Southfield council voted last week to set a public hearing March 24 to consider rezoning Ira Kaufman funeral home land on Nine Mile and North-western from commercial to residential.

Residents in the area want the rezoned back to residential. The planning commission recommended last week that the land remain commercial.

Petitions with 2,000 names recently demanded a referendum but state law does not provide for zoning by popular vote. The council summed it to commercial last summer.

DETROIT HAS refused to allow connection until burdies are cleared for the construction of the South-Oak drain (formerly the Eight Mile drain). Oakland county drain commission hopes to sign construction contracts for the South-Oak this summer.

Subdivisions involved are the proposed 80-home Evergreen Woods subdivision west of Evergreen near 12 1/2 Mile. The second is the proposed 120-home Kingsley Estates subdivision west of Evergreen on 1 1/2 Mile road.

Legal Loophole Tangles Decision On Expressway

SOUTHFIELD—Southfield's city charter and Michigan's Municipal Plan Commission Act don't coincide on the number of planning members required and as a result, the two-man differential may be a loophole in the state's battle to gain approval of the proposed east-west expressway.

The state requires nine members. The city charter provides for seven.

The figure seven was adopted by the city's charter commission, falling back on old township days when the area's plan group, had seven members.

The city made its first move about four months ago to set up a nine-member plan commission by ordinance, but there has been no action on the ordinance.

THE HIGHWAY department seized the legal point in an effort to nullify the plan commission's role in the approval.

The city "approved" the east-west for a second time in December by a 4 to 3 vote, but thought that five "yes" votes were needed to override the city's master road plan that does not provide for an east-west expressway within the city.

The state feels that this loophole circumvents any need for five votes because the state does not have the legal authority of the seven-member commission.

SOUTHFIELD MUST now determine if it can set up a nine-member plan commission to circumvent the charter and just what legal authority the present commission does have.

A hearing was slated last night by planners, legal or not, to hear the public views on the controversial proposed expressway.

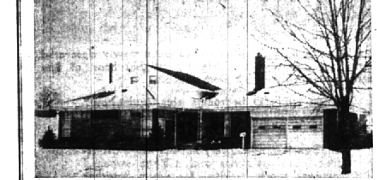

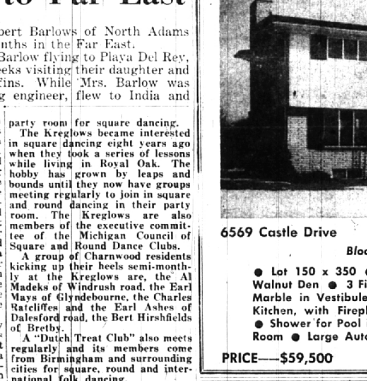

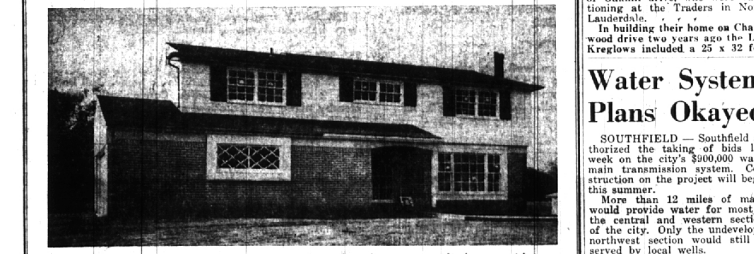

Water System Plans Okayed

SOUTHFIELD—Southfield authorized the taking of bids last week on the city's \$200,000 water main transmission system. Construction on the project will begin this summer.

More than 12 miles of mains would provide water for most of the central and western sections of the city. Only the undeveloped northern section would still be served by local wells.

Revenue bonds will be sold, the council also decided. Property owners who benefit from the project will pay \$100 when they connect to the mains. Residents fronting on mile roads where a main installation will pay an additional \$4 per front foot.

HOMES of other residential streets also will pay, in addition to the \$100, the cost of lateral water mains to connect to the roads.

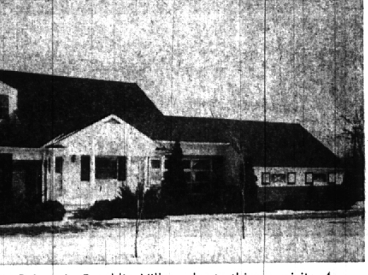
