Charles Turner's composition "Pastorale" will be presented Friday evening at 8:15 when the American Ballet Center company appear at Oak Park high school auditorium under the auspices of the South Oakland Community concert association.

Charles, son of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Turner Sr., of Kent road, Birmingham, lived in Birmingham from 1936 to 1942. He graduated from Baldwin high school in 1939, a valedictorian of his class.

HE STUDIED violin at the Detroit Institute of Musical Art with the late Wm. Granting and piano with Margaret Mannebach. He was an active member of the Birmingham Musician's first junior Musical.

Charles studied at the Julliard school in New York with Louis Persinger. About this time, he became more interested in composing and studied in Europe with Nadia Boulanger and later with Samuel Barber in New York.

His first orchestral composition, "Encounter" was written in 1954. It was premiered by the Cleveland orchestra in 1955 with B'ham Musicale Plans Benefit
