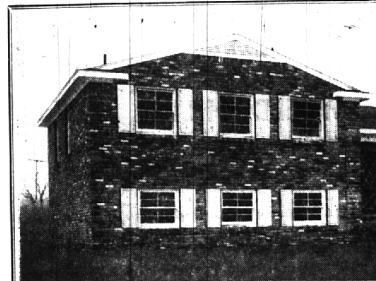
Stephen was born Jan. 28 to Mr. and Mrs. James Earl Beall, formerly of Beverly Hills.

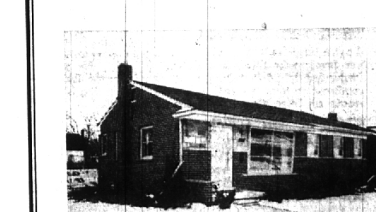

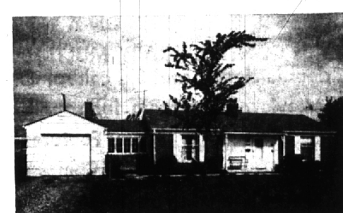
