Interested persons are invited to attend.

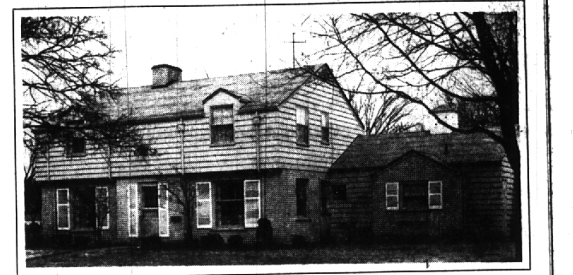
# In Airborne Division

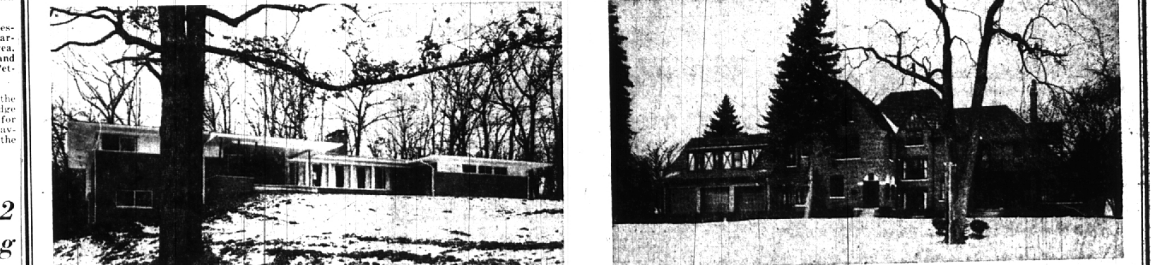
