Lathrup Sets Hearing On Proposed Zoning

LATHRUP—Mayor Richard N. Cogger has set March 7 at 8 p.m. for a second council public hearing on the proposed transitional-professional rezoning on Southfield road.

Petitioned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Kelley, Lathrup developers, the T-P-1 amendment to zoning ordinance 18 has traveled a lot of miles between zoning board of appeals, city attorney and council.

A public hearing on the amended ordinance was held by the city's zoning board of appeals. The change was approved and sent back to the council for a second public hearing in accordance with the city charter.

The public hearing was held Jan. 11, but certain discrepancies were pointed out by ex-mayor Lantz L. Mackey. The necessary changes made it mandatory to start all over again with a zoning board of appeals public hearing with City Attorney Everett Hayes raising the changes through to meet hearing deadlines.

IF THE ORDINANCE change is approved on March 7, it is expected to open property on the extreme south end of Lathrup on Southfield road to the construction of an American Automobile association insurance building, and allow the building of a post office north of the Kelley sales office. The rewritten ordinance change will allow only one drive-in window—that to be in the proposed post office building.

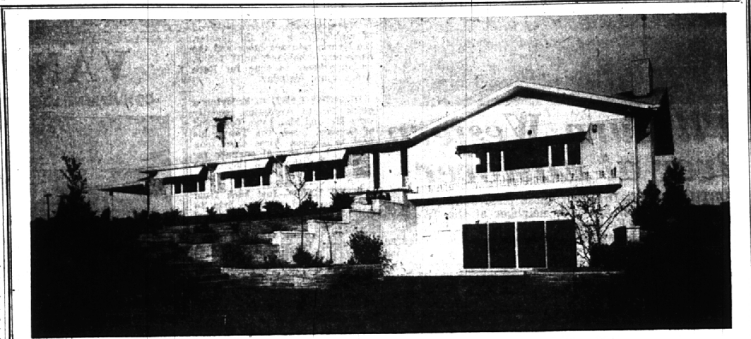
