AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 9
ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING CONDUCT CONSTITUTION AN OFFENSE BY PERSONS
WITHIN THE VILLACE OF BEVERLY HILLS: PREVENTING, VILLED, BISORDER AND IMMORALITY:
PROMOTING PUBLIC DEACE, SAFETY A NOHEALTH; PROTECTING PUBLIC MORALS; PROTECTING PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY; AND
PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF
ITS PROVISIONS.

THE VILLAGE; OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.01. That Section 6 (1) (b) of Ordinance No. 9 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Conduct Constituting An Offense By Persons Within The Village of Beverly Hills: Preventing Vice. Disorder and Immorality: Promoting Public Peace Safety and Health: Protect-Public Morals: Protecting Public and Private Property: And Prescribing Penalties for Violations of Its Provisions be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"The owning, driving or moving upon the public streets and alleys of trucks or other motor vehicles which are constructed or loaded so as to permit any part of its load or contents to blow, fall, or be deposited upon any street, alley, sidewalk or other public or private place, or which deposits from its wheels, tires, or other parts onto the street, alley, sidewalk or other public or private place, dirt, prease, sticky substances or foreign matter of any kind. Any person violating this subsection of the ordinance shall, in addition to other penalties, be subject to revocation of any and all villages to the ordinance of the content of the content of the content of the court. Provide however, that under circumstances determent, he may great persons temporate to the content of the correction of an agreement by such person to reimburse the Village for any extraordinary maintenance expenses incurred by the Village in connection with such violation.
