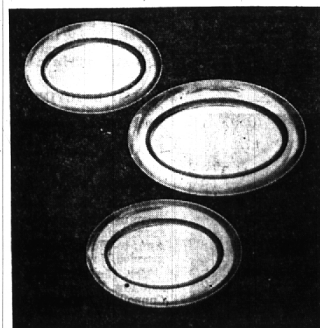

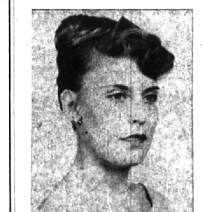
**Troth Reveals
