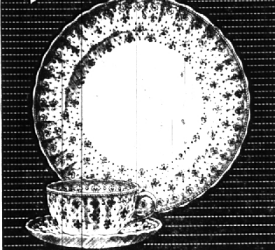

"Any success we have accomplished is due to the cooperation of our community in our projects and the willingness to participate and help to produce of our entire membership," a Lions spokesman said.
