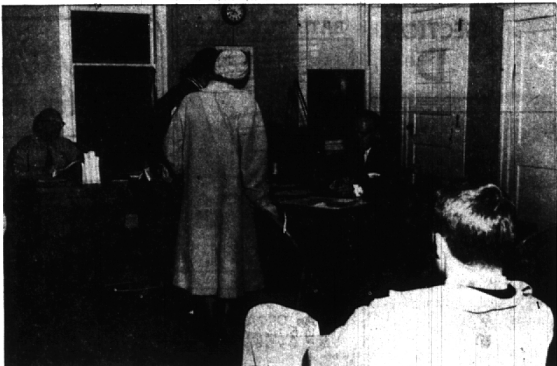

Your Court Report
Quiet Franklin's A Big Surprise
Police, Justice Court Active, Careless Drivers Discover

FRANKLIN—It probably comes as a super-sized surprise to most of the people of Franklin that they have a full-fledged justice court which meets every first Wednesday of the month at 7:30 p.m. in the village offices.
And it certainly comes as a surprise to many out-of-town drivers, who disregard the local speed limit signs posted.

Through the vigilance of a 14-man volunteer police force, about 20 cases a month are brought before Justice of the Peace Orland H. Ellis. Most of them are traffic violations and most of them are non-resident.

And 100 MANY of them are young drivers with devoted but misguided parents anxious to defend their wrong doings.
A practicing attorney and father of two sons, Ellis finds it peculiar to say the least, that the parents will often testify they are aware of the young driver's guilt but staunchly defend the act.

One mother stood next to her son before Ellis and said she urged him to drive faster than the allowed speed limit, because they were late for church. Ellis listened to her complain about the unreasonableness of the 45 mph limit on 13 Mile road. She said the family had lived west of Franklin for many years and they had become accustomed to driving the route east without being greatly concerned about speed.

Ellis reminded her that the area population was increasing and Franklin was no longer a "country". He suspended the son's driving license for ten days, plus a fine.

"ANOTHER mother created quite a fuss when Ellis fined her 17-year-old daughter \$15 for driving 15 miles in excess of the speed limit.
"You can't fine her. She's a minor," the mother protested.
"If she's old enough to have a driver's permit she's old enough to fine," said Ellis and he did.

ELLIS' COURT is not a very busy one, he's happy to say. One, in a while he gets a case which involves an acquaintance or a neighbor. Rather than judge friends in the community where he served as president of the Franklin Community association and in various capacities in Cub scouts and boy scouts, Ellis has a reciprocal agreement with Ted Sara, another Southfield J. FERTILIZE Your Lawn

NOW? CERTAINLY! How come? Well, it's like this. Fertilizer (plant food) applied now is right where it is needed when the grass first starts to grow. It has had time to begin breaking down into the form in which the grass can use it. Applied now, there is no danger of burning and no need to water it in. The thaws and Spring rains will carry it quickly to the roots. Many people like to spread fertilizer directly on top of a late snow-fall of about an inch. In this way you can see exactly where you have been. There is no danger of missing a strip or of over lapping.
Your grass will grow about 36 inches during the season. It takes a lot of nourishment to support this growth. Lawns that are underfed become sparse and thin. This is evidence of the death of thousands of individual grass plants. The resulting open bare spots, warmed by the sun, fill quickly with weeds from seed already in the ground—crabgrass, too. In other words, feeding the lawn not only helps the grass, but is also the first step in weed and crabgrass control.

How much and how often should you fertilize the lawn? Regardless of what it may say on the bag or in other ads you may read, your lawn requires 6 pounds of actual nitrogen per 1000 square feet each year—more if you have Merion blue grass. Our authorities are the county agents, M.S.U., Purdue, etc. This may be achieved by 3 applications of a good 10-6-4 fertilizer such as Avicor for Turf, Agrico Urea-Form or Stadler's XXX at the rate of 20 pounds per 1000 square feet, once each Spring, Summer and Fall. If you prefer to use one of the lightweight-high analysis materials, it must be applied once a month or at least 5 or 6 times during the season to get an adequate amount of nitrogen—more if you have a Merion lawn.

What's the best way to put this fertilizer on? With a Lawn Beauty Spreader, of course. Sizes from 16" to 30"—the best and most accurate—easiest to clean.
