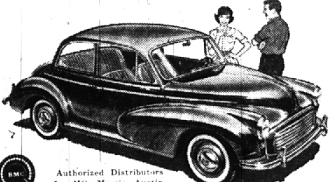


Look to the Future, But They Work Now

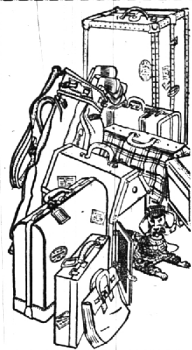
The charter signifies that the Birmingham club fulfills requirements established by a national advisory committee on Future Nurses Clubs. It was granted on the recommendation of Principal

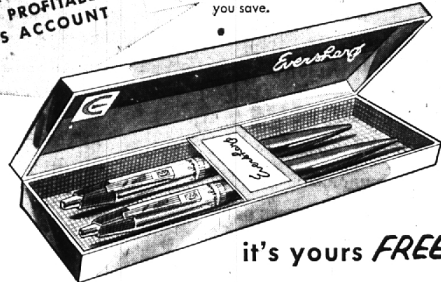
