NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE.

TAKE NOTICE that a public hearing will be held by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills on the 21st day of March, 1960, at 8 o'clock P.M. in the Village offices located in the aforesaid Village for the purpose of considering the following amendment to Ordinance No. 29, being the Zoning Ordinance:

1. To amend Section 10.04 of said ordinance by the addition of a new sub-section reading substantially as follows:

E. Standards. The types of uses requiring Zoning Board of Appeals approval shall be deemed to be permitted uses in their respective districts, subject, as to each specific use, to satisfaction of the requirements and standards set forth in this section. Each specific use for which a permit is sought should be considered as an individual case and shall conform to the detailed application of the following standards in a manner appropriate to the particular circumstances of such use. All uses as listed in any district requiring Zoning Board of Appeals approval for a permit shall be of such location, size and character that, in general, it will be in harmony with the appropriate and orderly development of the district in which it is situated and will not be detrimental to the orderly development of adjacent districts. The Zoning Board of Appeals shall give consideration to the following:

1. The location and size of the use.
2. The nature and intensity of the operations involved in or conducted in connection with it.
3. Its size, layout and its relation to pedestrian and vehicular traffic to and from the use.
4. The assembly of persons in connection with it will not be hazardous to the neighborhood or be incongruous therewith or conflict with the normal traffic of the neighborhood.
5. Taking into account among other things, convenient routes of pedestrian traffic, particularly of children.
6. Vehicular turning movements in relation to routes of traffic flow, relation to street intersections, site distance and the general character and intensity of development of the neighborhood.
7. The location and height of buildings, the location, nature and height of walls, fences and the nature and extent of landscaping on the site shall be such that the use will not hinder or discourage the appropriate development and use of adjacent land and buildings or impair the value thereof.
8. The nature, location, size and site layout of the use shall be such that it will be a harmonious part of the district in which it is situated taking into account, among other things, prevailing shopping habits, convenience of access by adjacent and passing patrons to the physical and economic relationship of one type of use to another and characteristic groupings of uses of said district.
9. The location, size, intensity and site layout of the use shall be such that its operations will not be objectionable to nearby dwellings, by reason of noise, fumes or flares of lights to a greater degree than is normal with respect to the proximity of commercial to residential uses.

All persons interested will be heard. Objections to the proposed amendment should be filed in writing and it is requested that any such communications shall be submitted to the Village Clerk not later than March 18th, 1960, so that they may be duplicated and forwarded to the members of the Village Council prior to the meeting of March 21st, 1960.
