Seven Detroiters gave eye-witness reports on Russia and her people on a university of Detroit television program, "I Saw Russia," recently on WTWS, Channel 56, Detroit's educational television station.

Among them was Mrs. William McGaughey, 131 Guilford road, Bloomfield Hills.

MRS. MCGAUGHEY, wife of an American Motors executive, sought an answer to the question, "Do Russian women prefer to work or would they like to stay home with their children?"

"Irene in Leningrad," Mrs. McGaughey reported, "saw no alternative and told me, 'Of course, I wouldn't stay home. I can't. I'm young and I must work.'"

"Middle aged women," Mrs. McGaughey said, "are either successful and these are few, or the forgotten women. You see these latter by the thousands. They are members of street gangs, clean up crews, and do the hard labor."

OLD WOMEN, she pointed out, don't "seem to feel the terrible frustration of some of our American older women. They retire at 55 and in many cases raise their grand children so their daughters may work."

For 42 years," Mrs. McGaughey pointed out, "these women have known no leisure as our women know it. No bridge clubs, no afternoon social activity. Nothing but hard work for a 48 hour week or more."
