Get Dog 'Shot' Now and Save Some Money

If your dog gets a two-year rabies shot this year, then next year this year's two-year shot will be taken into account, the Birmingham city commission promises.

It has asked for amendments to the city dog ordinance allowing two-year immunization shots for rabies. Dogs now must receive an inoculation each year before a dog license can be obtained.

DOG OWNERS will save some money, but not half the amount now spent on "shots". City clerk Irene Hanley, who issues the licenses, says two-year shots cost more than those for one year.

Because some owners may have purchased 1959 tags before the amendment is passed, when 1961 tags are bought, the commission said the city will honor two-year shots obtained now.
