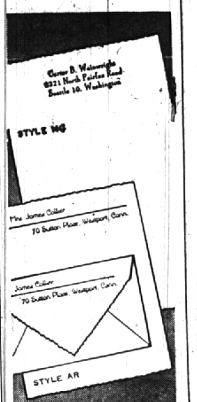
## Pi Beta Phi Alums Schedule Luncheon
