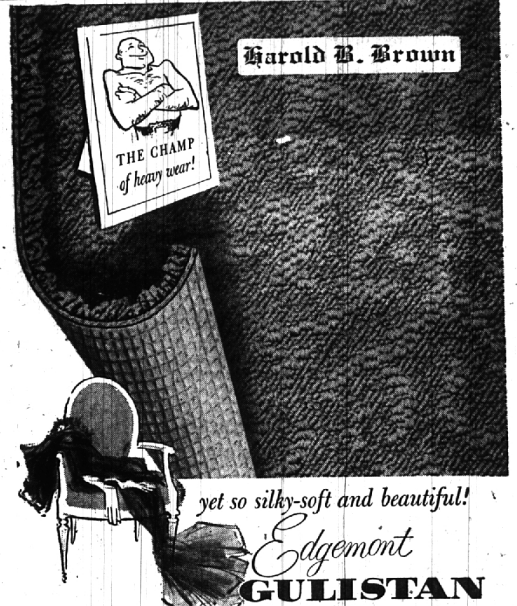
The American home group will hear a book review by Mrs. E. J. Kent with Mrs. Harry Allen as hostess for the day.

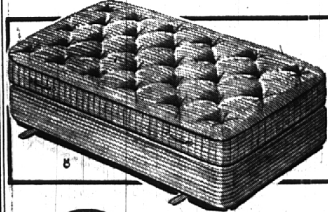

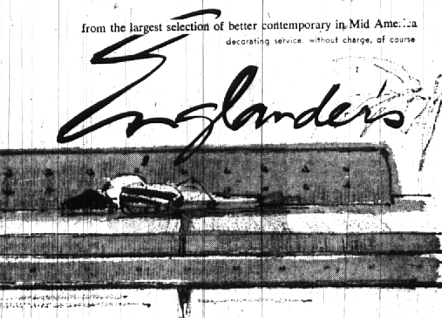
