

# Imagine if We'd Had A Really Good Year

Michigan can chalk up another good vacation travel year on its business calendar, according to the state tourist council.

"NOT TO MENTION the stiff competition from other tourist states and vacation areas," added Robert J. Furlong, council executive secretary.

A SURVEY of the resort and travel business around the state shows increases ranging from two per cent to 17 per cent, and a trend toward longer stays.

THE TOURIST council pointed out a nine per cent drop in fishing license sales and the phenomenal boom in boating, skiing and canoeing as reflecting a major shift in recreational travel interest.

NATIONAL travel experts predict Americans will spend at least \$15 billion on vacation travel in this country during 1960, the council report states.

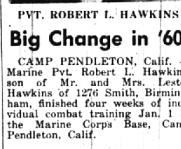
