Houseguests at the Michael Bells of Butternut Hill drive during the busy holiday season were Mr. and Mrs. John Polans of Pittsburgh.

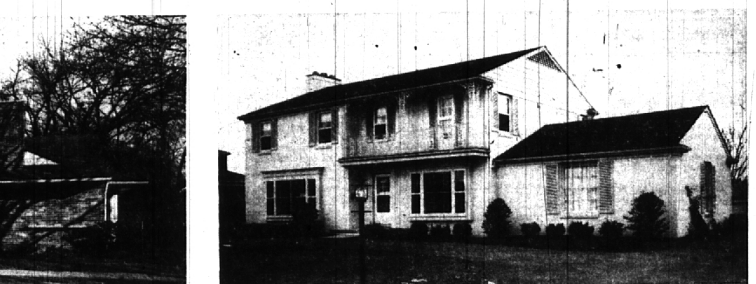

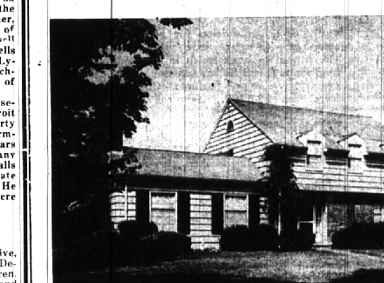
