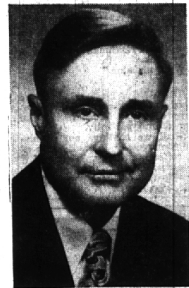


Slate Expert In 'Presidency' Classes Here

EAST LANSING—An outstanding student and teacher of political science will conduct an informal course in "The Dynamics of the

American Presidency," offered this winter in Birmingham by Michigan State University.

Teaching the course will be Dr. Edgar W. Waugh, professor of political science at M.S.U. Classes will be on Mondays at Seaholm high school from 8 to 10 p.m., beginning Jan. 25.

STUDENTS may register at either the first or second class sessions.

Dr. Waugh is the author of two books in the field of political science—"Heaven Speaks American" and "Second Consul: The Vice Presidency—Our Greatest Political Problem."

"This course covers the evolution of the presidency from its inception to the present," explained Dr. Waugh. "Major emphasis is given to current problems concerning the office—proposed reforms in nomination and election methods, the presidential inability riddle, the limitations of his foreign relations role, the changing status of the constitutional vice presidency, the question of the 22nd amendment and others."

The course is offered under the auspices of the M.S.U. program of "Liberal Arts Education for Adults," in cooperation with the Birmingham public schools.

Because the streets are next to a stream, state law requires court approval before they may be vacated.

"I believe it when I write it, but you have to forget in order to write something else. I happen to read them in the paper and I disagree violently sometimes."

GEORGE ROMNEY
