Dr. Clare Gates, planning director for health services of the United Community services will discuss planning and cooperation of United Community services in the health field.

OUTGOING Region IV officers included Donald H. Swanson, Mayor of Southfield.

Over 120 Mayors, village presidents, councilmen and other elected and appointed officials from League member cities and villages attending Region IV meeting heard sessions on water supply and pollution problems, county departments of public works, and a dinner report on the League legislative program for 1960. Region IV is made up of Genesee, Macomb, and Oakland counties.

Tri-county area problems of maintaining water tables, need for additional water sources, warnings of possible need for controls in this field, were explored by Norman Billings, Chief of the hydrology division, Water Resources commission.

H. G. McKITTRICK, assistant city manager of Sarnia and secretary of the Canadian-American Committee on Water Pollution, pointed up the problems of water pollution in the lower Lake Huron resulting from oil and gas drilling operations now going on in the area.

Second half of the Region IV program was devoted to a study of county departments of public works, their purpose and programs. R. J. Alexander, Director of the Oakland County Department of Public Works, spoke on the experiences of Oakland County which has had a county public works department, operating for the past two years.
