They Try a New Tack In Vocational Guidance

Something new in career clinics has been planned at Derby junior high school—this one is for parents. Sixteen career experts have been invited to participate in a career clinic for parents of Derby pupils Feb. 4 in the Derby school.

Parents will assemble at 8 p.m. in the gymnasium for instructions and then proceed to room at which gathering career information (cafeteria style) from the career experts at tables throughout the gym lobby and cafeteria.

PUPILS will give their parents a guide by taking home a check-list indicating their special career interests before the clinic.

It is not the objective of the PTA, which is sponsoring the career clinic, to encourage pupils to choose careers at the junior high age, but rather to inform parents about many fields of work so they may become do-it-yourself career counselors, according to A. Marriott Walker, PTA president.

Participating in the clinic are young career people—their ages average 29.4 years—who are already successful in their chosen fields.

FOURTEEN career categories will be represented: architecture; Mr. Jack Begrow of Begrow & Brown, Architects; Mr. Robert Schuler of Matheson, Dixon and Brady, engineering; Mr. Carl Chakmakian, automotive technical advisor for American Motors; science, Dr. Paul Tomboalian, assistant professor of chemistry at Michigan State University - Oakland; teaching, Dr. William Schwab, assistant professor of English, MSU-O; home economics, Miss Lucille Ingram, Detroit Edison home service advisor for Oakland county; nursing, Miss Carol Ann Pilon, emergency department head nurse and Miss Barbara Schicks, surgical floor staff nurse, at William Beaumont hospital; radio and television, Fran Maier and Philip Workman, both of the Detroit News; Mrs. Maier was formerly with The Birmingham Eclectic; commercial art, Mrs. Elaine Schattberger, fashion artist for J. L. Hudson company, advertising department; photography, Mr. Vernon Hammond, of Johnson & Shirk, Inc. of Birmingham; advertising, Mr. Robert Flenke of MacManis, John & Adams, Inc. and medicine, Dr. James E. Ladd.

In addition to these consultants, Mr. Donald Laatsch, eighth-grade counselor, will supply information and pamphlets concerning careers not represented and will answer parents' inquiries concerning the aid their children receive from the school's counseling service.

Mr. Lawrence E. Quinn, program

chairman, will introduce the Career Clinic participants, but there will be no speeches. The clinic will be conducted informally with parents asking their own individual questions at each table.

Troy News Briefs

State to Decide Troy Liquor Issue

TROY—Troy city commissioners evaded the issue of packaged liquor licenses in the city by deciding Monday not to send any recommendation to the state.

A Troy committee on liquor advised the commissioners Jan. 15 that no SDI licenses should be approved in Troy. The committee based its recommendation on 888 signed protests from Troy residents. There were 10 applicants for licenses.

The decision will now be left to the state.

Troy Extends Tax Deadline To Feb. 19

TROY—Troy extended city tax bill payment deadline to Feb. 19 at the city commission Monday.

Treasurer Leroy A. Hice said the payment deadline was extended 30 days last year. City Comptroller J. L. Hudson and George T. Yeokum made the request.

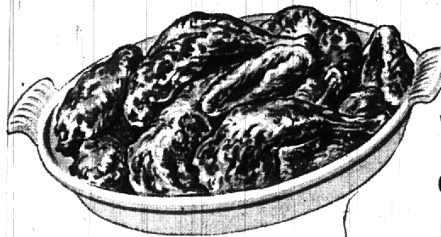
Dairy Bar Robbed
