S'field to Dedicate Library Jan. 31

SOUTHFIELD—Southfield library, the city's first, will be dedicated at 3 p. m. Jan. 31 with the opening of the new library, acting as master of ceremonies.

The library will remain open until 6 p. m. for public inspection. The structure which houses some 10,000 books is located at the southwest corner of LaSalle and 11 1/2 mile roads.

Hours will be 1 to 9 p. m. Monday through Thursday and from 9:30 a. m. to 5:30 p. m. Saturdays.

Clarkson to Act On Amending Zone Referendum

SOUTHFIELD—State Representative S. James Clarkson (4th district, Oakland county) said last week that he will introduce a bill in the legislature designed to amend the state zoning enabling act that fails to grant city residents the right of zoning referendum.

The announcement followed council action last week that ignored nearly 2,000 signatures in zoning referendum petitions submitted by an association in a zoning dispute.
