Questioned**

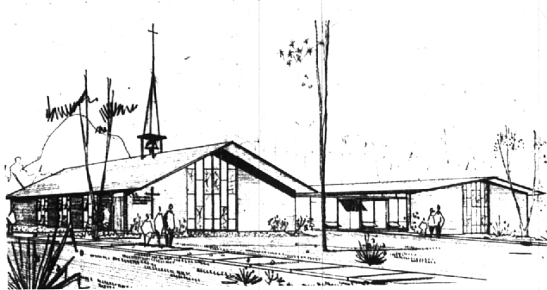
To the Editor:

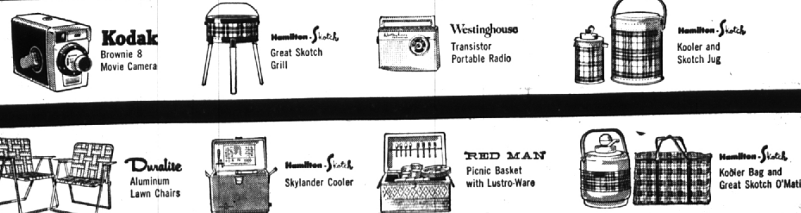
