

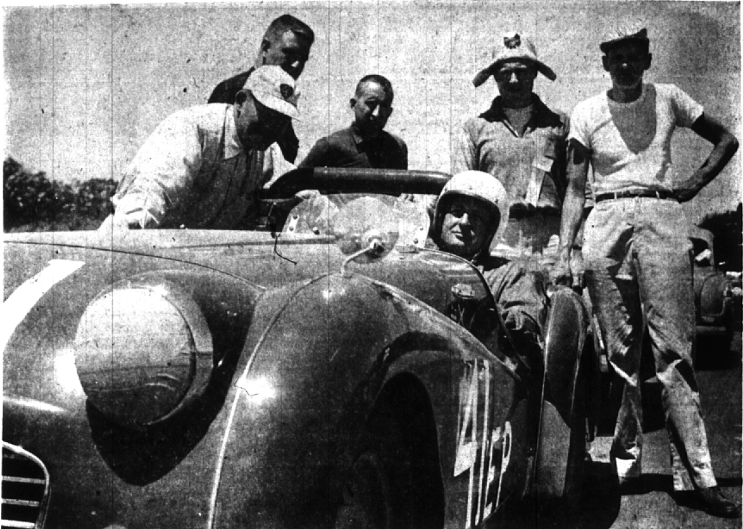

Bentley Backed By Colleague

Royal Oak-retired Eighteenth for the Republican nomination for District congressman George A. Dondoro has endorsed a former colleague, Rep. Alvin M. Bentley, the Oakland County Republican club meeting in Birmingham Wednesday night to make known his choice for the August 2 primary.

"I sat next to Congressman Bentley for four years in Washington," Dondoro said. "I learned to have great respect for his ability and his sincerity as a legislator."

DONDORO SAID Bentley "is a student of government affairs and keen analyst of our foreign relations."

Bentley, who has represented the Eighth District for eight years, is opposed in the August 2 primary by Don Leonard, former Michigan state police commissioner.
