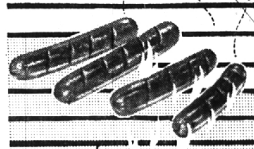

Troy News Briefs

Violence at Troy Plant

TROY—Violence reappeared at the Dynamic Manufacturers, Inc., plant as two fights broke out between former strikers and non-strikers.

The plant had been besieged by a violent 90-day strike by local 935, Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers which ended less than two months ago.

At the same time, Robert R. Reek, president of the local was suspended by the company for taking time off to attend a Troy justice court hearing involving Paul Coulter, Pontiac, and Jerry Yeagor, Rochester, two Dynamic employees.

Reek said his position as leader of the local made it necessary to attend the trial.

He said he was warned by Dynamic officials he would be suspended if he took time off for it.

Wanted: One City Manager!

TROY—The city of Troy will be without a city manager in three weeks, unless the city commission can soon decide on a replacement for David W. Hassie.

Hassie, the present city manager, is quitting his post at the end of July after a long dispute with the commission. The commission insisted that Hassie reside in Troy. The city manager did not consider this part of his job.

Four men are in contention for the \$10,500 a year job. They are John B. Hinan, former Oak Park assistant city manager; David E. Firestone, present clerk-treasurer; Lawrence Savage, former Cheboygan city manager; and a candidate named Brown.

The commissioners have had two private meetings to select a replacement for Hassie, but so far have failed to agree on anyone.

Troy Board Favors Low, Not Local Bids on Contracts

TROY—A request by a Troy businessman to award sub-contracts to local and state firms instead of out-of-state companies met with a lukewarm response from the Troy school district.

The businessman, Archie Linn, owner of Archie's Lumber and Millwork, Inc., 2304 Livermore, made the request after losing a sub-contract for millwork on a new elementary school and additions to a Louisville, Ky., firm.

Ben S. Jones, president of the board, answered the request with this statement: "We have an obligation to get the most for our tax dollars," said Jones. "We try to keep the work in Michigan whenever possible."
