Lathrup Circuit 2 Years to Build Storm Sewers

Apartment Hearing Is Slated

BEVERLY HILLS—The "ten-story" proposal to rezone the 13 Mile-Evergreen intersection's northeast corner to a cooperative apartment zoning will get a public hearing Aug. 15.

The Beverly Hills council set the hearing date Tuesday after reviewing the village planning board's recommendation that the proposal be rejected.

KEATING, O'Neill and a third investor want to build two ten-story buildings to house approximately 200 luxury-type cooperative apartments. They would be priced at from \$20,000 to over \$40,000.

Councilman Hugh C. Allerton, Jr. moved for the public hearing on the proposal. Councilmen John A. McClanahan and Leo J. Linsinger voted against the hearing.
