Bloomfield Village Urges Road Program

BLOOMFIELD VILLAGE — The Bloomfield Village protective association last week urged citizen support for a new two-year road repair and reconstruction program.

A letter mailed to every home in the village's three subdivisions by the citizen's group pointed out that signatures of owners of at least 65 percent of the assessable footage must be obtained on petitions before roads can be improved. Volunteers are now circulating the petitions.

Under the program proposed the Oakland county road commission would resurface the present seal coat pavements with bituminous aggregate plus curb and gutter construction and other incidental work necessary. The commission has estimated total cost at \$382,925.

The association said the two-year program, with work to be done and paid off in two yearly assessments, was proposed to meet objections that last year's five-year plan would "take too long to get the work done."
