Absence Causes Council to Oust Associate Judge

SOUTHFIELD—John H. O'Brien of Southfield is no longer the city's associate municipal judge. O'Brien has been elected Australia for most of his two-year term and because of his long absence, Southfield councilmen appointed Alexander C. Perinoff, a leading contender for past open city post, to take the post.

O'BRIEN, an attorney with Chrysler's export division, was elected associate judge April 21, 1958. He was sent to Australia prior to the election. Planning to return soon after his election, he was sworn into office in Australia by a U. S. consul.

He returned to Southfield in the summer of 1959, sat on the bench one day and then returned to Australia.

THE NEW associate, Perinoff was continuing for the council seat Clarence A. Durbin was appointed to earlier this year.
