**Rori Makes No Bones About Title**

Rori may lead a dog's life, but what a time he has doing it! The two-year-old great dane, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Rudy Hilsen of Farmington, has built a spectacular award winning career.

Traveling to various states for national competition, the three foot, 190 pound pup, who is still filling out, seldom finds himself in the doghouse. Especially, since Champion Rori of Noblebrook became the youngest great dane in

Michigan to finish his championship at 17 months. Dances usually complete their championship perioda between three and five years of age, said Mrs. Hilsen.

Last week the muscular fawn-colored champion pranced off with a three foot trophy in the Cleveland Specialty Great Dane Show. He was named the "best of breed" over 64 danes from all over the country, including nine champions.

WINNING national contests has become quite routine for Rori, who has been competing since he was three months old. He is entered in shows almost every week, adding more links to his chain of victories.

A dog like Rori comes one in 10,000," said Mrs. Hilsen. People are saying he is the best dane in the country, but Rori will settle for a big juicy bone instead of flattery anyway.

At the rate he's been winning shows, Rori has a good chance of becoming the finest great dane in the United States. The dane winning the most specialty and dog shows becomes the U. S. champion.

Rori has sired three litters of puppies, but the Hilsens have kept only two. Its too early to tell if they will take after their "puppa".

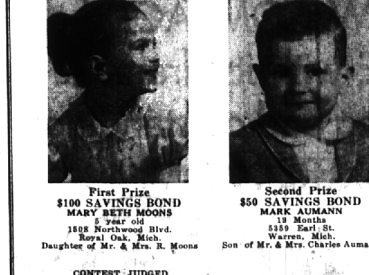

offsets a misfortune. A burial at sea three years ago, considered bad luck in sailor's circles, was evened-up with a marriage aboard the Aquarama last year.

"THAT WEDDING was one of the nicest things that ever happened in my life," he said. "And since then, everything's been running smoothly. A birth aboard ship means even better luck, he added.

Born in St. George, Ontario, Howell holds a deep-rooted respect for the United States, which is evident in his proud smile at the mention of the words. As a young man, he took the ferry across the Detroit river and has never returned.

"I came over here without a dollar in my pocket," he said. He met his wife, an English immigrant, and made a comfortable living. Howell recalled the words of the federal judge who authorized his citizenship papers over 39 years ago.

"NOW YOU are a citizen and can have any job in the United States, except the presidency," said the judge. "That we reserve for a native born citizen. But, you can be vice president."

"Those words hit me right between the eyes," said Howell, who spends some of his free time speaking to students at Birmingham schools.

Howell's alma mater is Tri State college in Angola, Indiana, which he attended in the days of the depression. A graduate of the Atlantic Merchant Marine Academy, he possesses a string of seven war and peace-time medals.

This is the only country in which you can rise from nothing to something," said Howell. "I know, I did it."
