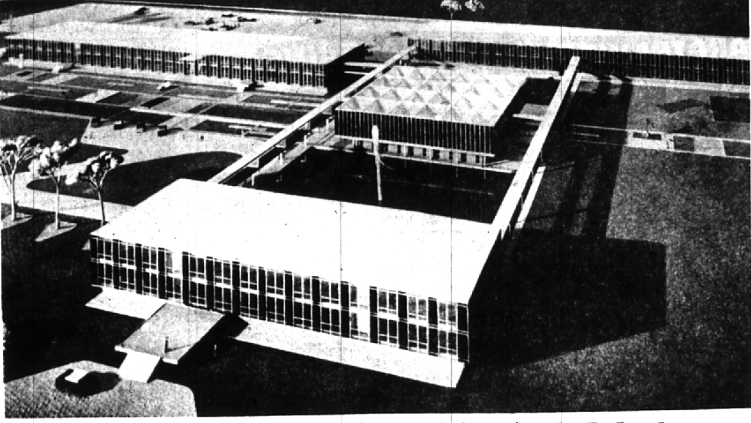

Goodwill Industries of Detroit want to hire more physically handicapped men and women to do so, it must add to its facilities. New equipment is needed and more floor space must be added to the plant at 6522 Brush.

FUNDS For buildings a d equipment, however, must come from contributions made for this specific purpose. The last campaign for capital funds was made in 1946 at the time Goodwill Industries purchased the Brush-Boulevard building.

The Board of Directors carefully analyzed the potential of the organization. We found that by adding 14,000 square feet of floor space and necessary new equipment such as dry cleaning and laundry machines and a new heating system, it would be possible to employ 150 additional handicapped workers, said Robert J. Wether, president of the board of directors.

"THESE industries require \$150,000 of capital funds," Weber added. "The board of directors authorized a capital fund campaign in this amount to be conducted among corporations, foundations, and individuals."

"To date contributions and pledges from 70 business firms, 15 foundations and 76 individuals total \$24,000. However, one pledge of \$25,000 included in this total is provisional and will not be paid until Goodwill Industries has raised the first \$125,000 of the campaign," continued Weber.

"WITH \$65,500 to go, we are appealing to business firms and individuals to send in their contributions which will make it possible for us to provide employment for many handicapped persons who are waiting only for the opportunity of proving they can be self-supporting if given a chance at Goodwill Industries."

Contributions to the Goodwill Industries Expansion Campaign are tax deductible. Checks should be made payable to Goodwill Industries of Detroit Campaign and should be mailed to 6522 Brush, Detroit 2, Michigan, Attention-Treasurer.

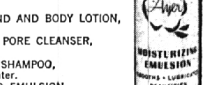
