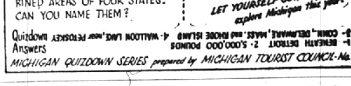

Seven rounds will be held, each in a different fishing area in Michigan and for a different kind of fish. In the Michigan state championship tournament, anglers need
