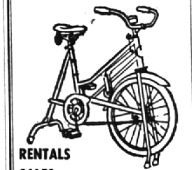

WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

Meningitis Not Inherited

• Jaw Click
• Diabetic Outlook

Q. What is spinal meningitis and is there a cure? Is there any danger or possible risk to adjoining of a person who has had the disease? Is insanity the eventual outcome of meningitis?

A. Many people have this experience at times. There is no cause for alarm, provided the jaw functions in a normal manner. It is very likely that the click will disappear in time. If not, a competent oral surgeon should be consulted.

Q. I have a 10-year-old son who has diabetes. He takes 15 units of insulin once a day. How do you answer my questions. Will he outgrow it? If not, will he require more or less insulin as he gets older?

A. At the present time diabetes must be considered a chronic and incurable disease. There is a tendency for it to get worse with time, but there are many exceptions to this general rule. One doctor observed 45 diabetic patients for more than five years. The insulin requirements increased in 21, decreased in 10, and remained the same in 14. The important thing in diabetes is to keep the disease under control by proper diet and, if needed, insulin or insulin-like drugs for necessary adjustment of blood sugar levels. The diabetic who abides by these measures has every reason to expect a normal, happy life.

Q. I have recently developed quite a click in the right side of my jaw. It is loud enough to be embarrassing when I eat. Would you advise treatment or will it go away?

A. A click in the jaw is usually one of the early signs of temporomandibular joint dysfunction. It is often associated with stress, teeth grinding, or a change in bite. Treatment usually involves a soft diet, stress management, and possibly a bite guard. It often resolves on its own.
