## Selfridge Wing In N. C. Exercise

Preparations are well advanced at the 408rd Troop Carrier Wing headquartered at Selfridge Air Force Base near Detroit for this summer's major Air Force/Army joint maneuvers scheduled for mid-August in North Carolina.

The war games, called Exercise Bright Star-Pine Cone III, will begin Aug. 13 and continue through the 27th.

Under the command of Reserve Colonel James H. McPartlin, of 3930 West Orchard Hill drive, Birmingham, the 408rd and three squadrons will perform a two-week tour of training in support of this tactical operation.

**THE MANUEVERS** are designed to provide individual and unit training in joint operations as five battle groups of the crack 101st Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, Kentucky are delivered and fight a simulated battle in the forthcoming operations will be the participation of Air Force Reserve units of the 1st National Guard units. The Reserve will supply more than 600 C-119 cargo type aircraft for carrying troops and supplies and the Air Guard will contribute 60 F-84 Thunderjets. In all 14 of the 15 Reserve troop carrier wings will be called to active duty for training.

Efficient, speedy back stopping of active duty Air Force units by widely scattered Reserve groups has become increasingly vital to total Air Force readiness.
