

## Swim Pool To Open for Beverly Residents

BEVERLY HILLS — "Come on in, the water's fine," is what the Beverly Hills village council is telling village residents about this new pool at Groves junior-senior high school. Residents responded enthusiastically to recent soundings taken by the council to determine demand for swimming facilities. On an experimental basis, the pool will be available to village swimmers from 2 to 4 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday for

the two weeks beginning Aug. 1. Councilman John A. McClanathan, recreation chairman, said there was enough money in his budget to make the pool available for two additional weeks if attendance is high. Admission fees will be 50 cents for adults and 25 cents for children. From them, the village expects to recover about half the \$27 per hour cost of renting the pool and paying life guards.

## Beverly Hills Awards Contracts For Road Repairs

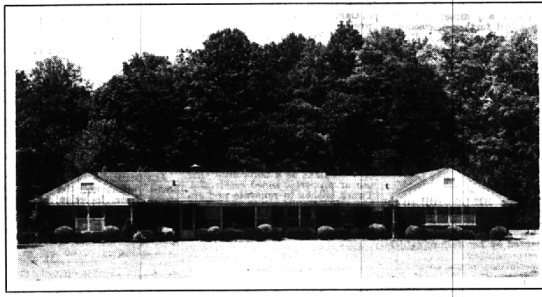
BEVERLY HILLS — Contracts for road repairs to be financed by a one-half mill road tax were awarded by the Beverly Hills village council last week.

Councilman Leo J. Linsenmeyer, roads chairman, said the \$20,212 total to be spent would use up most of the funds to be collected by the \$1 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation charged on July tax bills. Linsenmeyer said about 21 trouble spots are earmarked for the work, to include excavation, grading, drainage, and bituminous aggregate surfacing.

AMONG THE spots labeled for attention are three each on Sheridan, Riverside and Warwick. Also parts of Drury lane, Bates, Birmingham, Buckingham, Kinross, Norchester and Eastlady.

At the same time contractors will pave a 200-foot strip on Devonshire, postponed last year because of the high \$3,186 cost. When combined with the other work, the project's cost will be \$2,042. It will be paid by special assessment against six residents who petitioned for it.

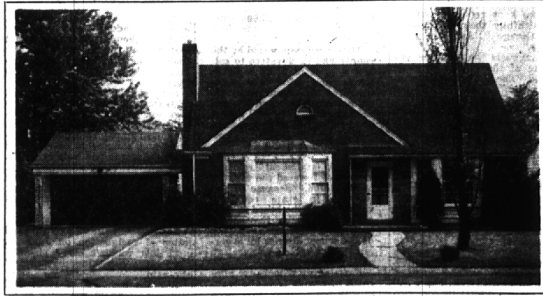
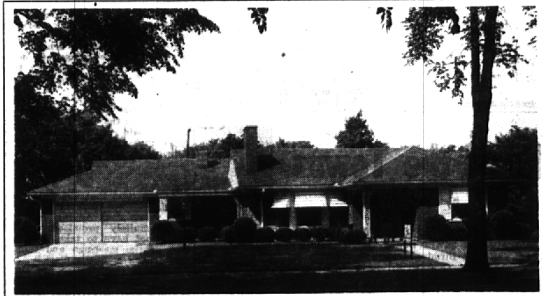

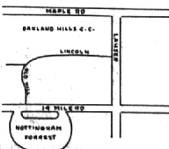
