**Chipmunk Family**  
**Popular Woodsmen**

All who frequent the out-of-doors know the chipmunk. Although he is a cousin of the squirrel, most of his life is lived on the ground scuttling over grass and stones, dodging under rocks and brush piles.

After cutting some trees on our lawn, we acquired a wood pile. In due time a family of chipmunks moved in and have been with us ever since as friendly dwellers sharing our days. Their favorite pastime besides eating is playing hide and seek in the wild flower garden which as summer advances will provide an increasing supply of berries and seeds. In the meantime the surrounding oaks ripen their acorns, another favorite food-source.



**U N L I K E** HIS COUSINS the squirrel, the chipmunk prefers some open space where he can romp and sun himself. Smaller than the red squirrel he is easily recognized by his bold light and dark stripes on head and body.

The chipmunk is an omnivorous eater. When his cheek pouches are stuffed, his head is nearly trobled in size as if he had a bad case of mumps. Many seeds and nuts are included in his diet as are insects and mice and the young of scowls and nesting birds. But he is also preyed upon by hawks and owls, by huddlers and weasels. The latter pursue their hapless victim underground.

**W H E N** DIGGING his burrow this little rodent is very careful not to leave any telltale signs of his whereabouts. He comes and goes by diverse ways and so does not wear a path to his doorstep. His winter tunnel which extends below frost line is complete with grass-lined bedroom and a well stocked pantry. Since he does not put on extra fat, it is usually conceded that his winter sleep is in-

**W I T H I N** A BRIEF time the young, with their sprightly ways and their little upheld tails, grow into appealing creatures. They soon learn what foods to eat, how to shun their enemies and how to make friends if food is the reward. **T H E** DAMAGE CREATED by chipmunks is slight. They have little to do with the damage done when they are absent, a cheery note of friendliness is missing in the out-of-doors. There are some 60 species in the United States, many closely resembling one another. In Michigan the eastern chipmunk is found throughout the state while the least chipmunk is present only in the upper peninsula.

Now in deep summer this small rodent goes his way foraging, rearing the young, romping in his leisure time and following his zestful animal ways. When autumn approaches, he will dig and stock his burrow in anticipation of the on-coming lean days of winter when he will once more dwell within the root-smelling darkness of mother earth.
