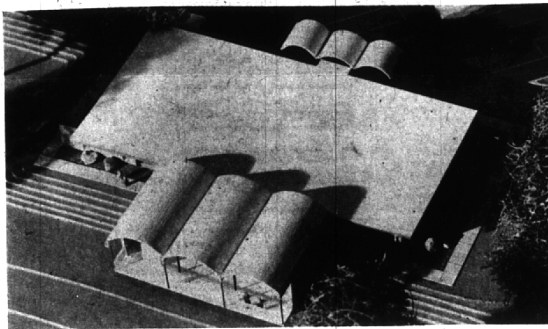

New Library Under Construction

WEST BLOOMFIELD—West Bloomfield residents will see this model become reality in January, 1961, the construction deadline for the new main library of the West Bloomfield system. Building is under way at the site of Orchard Lake road, between the township hall and Walnut Lake road. Anthony R. Moody of W. Brown street, Birmingham, is the architect for the structure that is being built from steel columns with laminated wood beams and a vaulted roof over the library lounge-community meeting area. lation growth in many of the townships," the association stated, "the number of persons who are able to attend the annual meeting are only a very small percentage of the total registered voters."

Their recommendation continued, "Those attending are not always concerned about the best interests of the township as a whole, but often represent an organized minority and the holding of such annual meetings in the more heavily populated townships is impractical and contrary to the original intention of the legislature."

If the once-a-year meetings are abolished, it would leave township governments operating on a similar basis to city commissions with voters having the right to petition the board and attend any meetings.

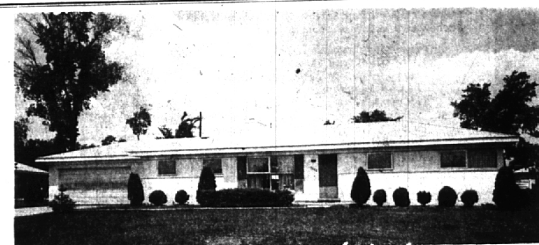

According to the findings of the committee, the assessor's office will prepare the general and special assessment and tax rolls, and spread the tax on the rolls.

IN THE PAST, certain improvements to properties, such as weed cutting and road oiling have been added to the tax roll. The committee found that it is not the duty of the clerk and that the village should establish a policy governing the matter and that the assessor's office would take it over.

The committee also urged that all personnel should be familiar with the work in other departments, so that if required because of vacation, illness or peak demand that they could fill in temporarily.

IN OTHER ACTION, the council discussed village insurance, postponed the purchase of another police car and discussed easements of sanitary sewers and the ordinance regarding operation, maintenance, construction and connection of the sewers.

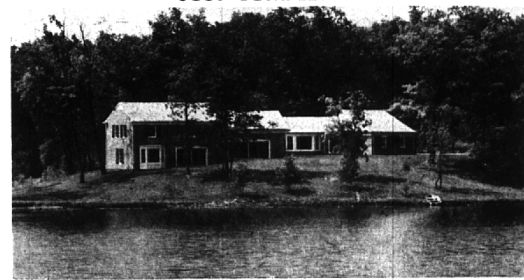

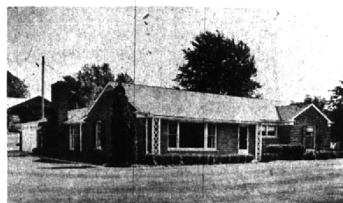
