

Southfield Offers Summer Program

SOUTHFIELD—A grand total of 359 students are enrolled in Southfield's elementary summer school program this year. The classes are being held at Lathrup, Lederle and Angling road schools under the direction of Miss Mary Louise Lake.

The program, inaugurated this summer for the first time in Southfield's school district, offers nine subjects for students in grades three through eight, with typing being offered to students in grades three through 11.

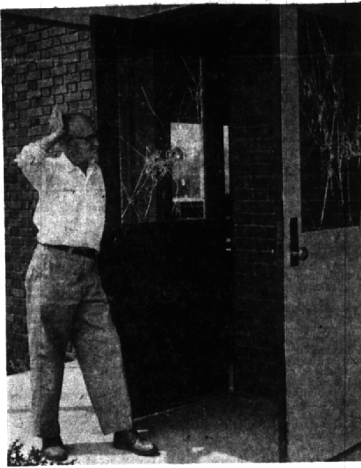
Subjects include reading, remedial reading, arithmetic, remedial arithmetic, language, arts, and speech correction. Other subjects offered are music, typing and a science workshop.

CLASS PERIODS are two hours in the morning for five days per week. Half the class period is devoted to instruction and the balance to study, excepting remedial reading which takes one hour of intensified instruction.

Ten teachers and a director are employed at a total cost of \$6,100. The program is self-supporting. Miss Lake's main recommendation is that fees should be collected prior to the close of school to enable early decisions as to classes needed. A minimum enrollment is required for each class.

The science workshop is a purely experimental type with each child working on his chosen project three times a week. The remaining two days are devoted to instruction and field trips. This summer's science program is regarded as a "pilot" program which will determine similar offerings in the future.

ACCORDING TO Miss Lake's report, accepted by the board of education at its July 11 meeting, the science program "could be one of the enrichment programs for the gifted as requested by many parents."

Southfield News Briefs

Southfield Schools To Borrow \$561,000

The Southfield board of education has voted to borrow \$561,000 to cover operating expenses until anticipated state aid funds roll in from Lansing.

At the same meeting, the board awarded its school bus insurance contract to the Conklin insurance agency of Lathrup and delayed awarding contracts for playground equipment at Birney school and a utility truck for recreation and athletic field improvement pending further study by board members.

Before the school district can officially borrow the \$561,000, it will have to obtain approval from State Superintendent of Public Instruction Lynn Bartlett.

Old Drains May Be Used

SOUTHFIELD—A plan to use 30-year-old storm drains along Eight Mile road as part of the stalled South-Oak storm drain project has been suggested by Ron S. James Clarkson (D-Southfield). Clarkson is asking Attorney General Donald Adams for an opinion concerning the drains, which were capped in 1932 after two supreme court cases, concerning proposed assessments, ended construction.

Clarkson is also asking the highway department not to pull out its participating in drain costs until the state's opinion is rendered.

Oakland county maintains that bond holders may still hold rights on the drains, costing possibly as much as \$500,000 if the drains are touched.
