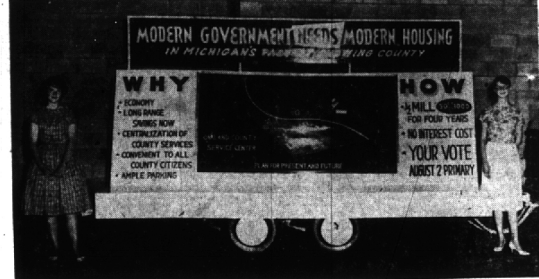

**Bits of Birmingham**

Speaking of the possible incon-  
 gruous situations that can develop  
 where heavily populated townships  
 continue to hold annual meetings,  
 Henry M. Hogan Jr., 4253 W. Or-  
 chard Hill, told this Wanderer:  
 "There is a story about the mar-  
 ried students at a college in the  
 east who went to a township meet-  
 ing in a body and just for kicks  
 (and to prove a point) forced on  
 the township board a resolution  
 which they adopted by majority  
 vote. It called for the construction  
 of a mile-high monument as a  
 memorial to veterans or something  
 . . . The students, because they  
 weren't married and resided perma-  
 nently there, weren't all registered  
 voters. It hasn't been built yet,  
 but it's still an obligation of the  
 township government," Hogan said.

Birmingham voters may want to  
 specially note the American flag at  
 their polling place next Tuesday.  
 A little-known section of Michigan  
 election law dictates that "a flag  
 of the United States, made of class  
 "A" bunting and of dimensions  
 not less than 3 feet in length . . .  
 be displayed in each polling place  
 during the progress of elections.  
 The law prefers the flag to be in  
 the voting area, but permits it to  
 be displayed on the structure if  
 balloting takes place in a public  
 building."

Lem Winchester, vibes man who  
 performed in June at Birmingham's
