## **KEEPING BUSY?**

WEEDS & GRASS IN DRIVEWAY: Apply CAL-CIUM CHLORIDE or HAMMONDS WEED KILLER. (Do not use Hammonds if tree roots or shrub roots are under the area treated.)

DUST: Can be laid to rest by spreading 100 lbs. of CALCIUM CHLORDE on each 600 sq. ft. of driveway or road. About 6 to 8 weeks later apply again at half the rate. Water lightly after spreading.

BROWN PATCH: — Will appear on bent and blue grasses during July and August. Sometimes patch is edged with dark blue or black ring. Spray weekly with ACTL-DIONE R.Z. Avoid saturating the soil so excessive moist areas occur. Do not water in the evening.

LACE BUGS: — Check underside of leaves of rhodo-dendron, azaleas, laurel, elms, hawthornes, as the second brood may be starting its destructive work. Use ISOTOX or Mc-B INSECT SPRAY.

VESPA WASPS: — They love the bark of lilacs. Dust or spray the branches with DDT or DD-IDE now.

PEACH BORDER: — Are now starting to by eggs at base of trunk. Hatching is quick and the grubs immediately enter the inner back. Then memmy stuff appears and protects the grub. Apply DD-IDE now and again in two or three weeks. (Spray branches also for the "lesser" peach borer.)

WATER:—Can be easily sent on its gay way through a fountain or bird bath or cascade with a LITTLE GIANT PUMP. With regulating valve the No. 2 pump retails for \$29.95. It is small, electric, noiseless and guaranteed.

BIENNIALS: — Early August is the time to sow ansy, English daisy, forget-me-not, Canterbury bell,

FOOD:—All the flowers need another dressing now with STADIER'S GARD-N-GRO (4-12-4) or AGRICO for gardens (5-10-5). Remember that well nourished plants have good deep root systems which can gather more water with which to carry the fertilizer to the leaves where it is changed into a useful food.
